

Great news from the Pastoral Council:

Dear Parishioners.

We have more exciting news to share with you! Over the last month, I have written about our new radical kinship model for the parish which focuses on importance of each ministry regularly praying, serving, and socializing together and about our two new parish-wide service outreach projects-a local one with Catholic Charities' St. Francis Youth Center in East Palo Alto and a global one with Fr. Ed's parish in Nigeria. Today, I am happy to share about our new monthly radical kinship workshops that will be led by Father Jerome, the Pastoral Council, Cheri Girardot, and Sarah Berger Gonzalez. The theme for this year will be "Building Community." At these workshops, we will learn more from Father about how we can build community at St. Raymond Church and how the radical kinship model can increase engagement in our ministries, in our faith, and with our community.

We will invite several ministries at a time to each workshop, and we hope that everyone in those ministries and those interested in joining a ministry will be able to attend this joyous opportunity for sharing our faith! Our first workshop will be **Saturday**, **February 22**, **9:00 am - 12:00 pm**, in the Arbor House (rectory) with an optional Mass beforehand at 8:15 am in the chapel. The ministries that are invited are **STARS**, **the Rummage Sale**, **Altar Society**, **Small Groups/Faith Sharing**, **Bible Study**, **Welcoming/Hospitality**, **and Ushers and Greeters**. You will be hearing from your ministry leader shortly and announcements will be made by Father Jerome at the next two weekend's Masses.

We also especially hope that if you have ever been curious about or ever thought about possibly joining one of the above ministries, that you attend as well! Please come even if you aren't sure that you can engage in a ministry at this time. It will be a wonderful opportunity to learn more about these ministries and to share our faith together.





Due to the generosity of parishioners, at our Christmas Masses we gave away 500 copies of a book entitled "Rediscovering the Saints". I received positive feedback from parishioners about how it helped their spiritual lives. For Easter, I would like to give away a book entitled, "A Father Who Keeps His Promises: God's Covenant Love in Scripture".

Many people want to read the Bible cover to cover, a noble undertaking. However, after reading Genesis and they Exodus. encounter Leviticus and, if they get through it, then Numbers, and abandon the project. "A Father Who Keeps Promises" is a high-level view of the Bible. It allows the reader to understand the big picture of the Bible, timelines, key events and
