HOMELESS FAMILY FUND

The COVID-19 pandemic has impacted us all in profound ways but falling disproportionately on marginalized and vulnerable populations.

In responding to the signs of the times, the Homeless Family Fund at St. Raymond Parish is partnering with Catholic Charities San Mateo and St. Francis of Assisi Parish in East Palo Alto to identify individuals and families in need of support to cover basic necessities and to provide information referrals to other services and opportunities in the County.

What has St. Raymond supported to date?

- Disbursed \$97,986.20 to cover rental assistance for the current month; and, for those that who were in arrears due to unemployment from COVID-19 and other reasons, we have brought them up to date;
- Prevented 25 households (including 34 adults and 39 children) from being evicted;
 and
- Provided, through Catholic Charities, just-in-time information referrals to other services and benefits within the San Mateo County system including CalFresh, Legal Aid, and employment.

The applicant and his wife, who have 7 children (18, 17, 13, 10, twins that are 4 and a 1-year-old), approached Fr. Goode in September 2020 to seek rental support as they were in arrears and unable to pay the month of October. The applicant lost his construction job due to the COVID-19 pandemic and burned through all of their savings to prevent eviction.

Fr. Goode was able to provide some financial support for the WiFi and electricity service so the kids could continue to attend school online safely but was unable to provide the rental support needed and referred them to the Homeless Family Fund. The HFF was able to provide \$5,600 in rental support to prevent eviction and cover the family's rent through October. St. Raymond Parish was also able to provide a gently used stroller so the family could get around the neighborhood with the younger kids. Catholic Charities referred the families to CalFresh and WIC for additional services and benefits. The applicant has since been able to find employment again.

The applicant, a single 59-year old woman, was working at the San Francisco 49ers Levi Stadium as a concession worker until the park was closed due to the COVID-19 outbreak. Unable to pay her rent, she was evicted and has since moved in with a neighbor, where she has been renting a room for \$200 a month, but unable to pay the neighbor.

In September, the neighbor let her know that she would have to evict her if she didn't start paying the rent in arrears and rent moving forward. The applicant approached Fr. Goode for support and Fr. Goode referred her to the Homeless Family Fund. The Fund was able to provide \$1,400 in support, covering 6 months in arrears and the month of October. During the month of October, Catholic Charities was also able to provide important information referrals for other services to support her as she looked for employment.

WE NEED YOUR HELP! We have 15 applications waiting for assistance and anticipate more with the moratorium on eviction ending January 31, 2021.

THE FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING OF THE UNIVERSE

"The entire material universe speaks of God's love, his boundless affection for us. Soil, water, mountains: everything is, as it were, a caress of God." (#84)

In Laudato Si', Pope Francis addressed not only the care of nature, but also of our brothers and sisters. He said: "We have to realize that a true ecological approach always becomes a social approach; it must integrate questions of justice in debates on the environment, so as to hear both the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor." (#49)

Today's gospel is again about the end times. Jesus' message to his listeners and to us is that we will be judged by how we treat each other, especially our brothers and sisters in need. Do we take the opportunity to offer help when we can, or do we cross the road and walk past? Jesus spoke of giving food to the hungry, drink to the thirsty, welcoming strangers, clothing the naked, caring for the ill, and visiting those in prison. For us, this can mean a family member, our neighbor, someone who is homeless, an illegal immigrant..... We have so many opportunities! Will we use them?

"The deterioration of the environment and of society affects the most vulnerable people on the planet." (#48)

"We are faced not with two separate crises, one environmental and the other social, but rather with one complex crisis which is both social and environmental. Strategies for a solution demand an integrated approach to combating poverty, restoring dignity to the excluded, and at the same time protecting nature." (#139)

So, while I invite you to grab your sweatshirt, your hat, your water and your mask to take a walk and marvel at the changing seasons, I urge you also to help someone in need. Some ideas are:

- If you have a family member that needs help, step up.
- Table of Plenty: Bake cookies for our homeless and low income brothers and sisters (watch the bulletin for dates).
- St. Vincent de Paul: bins are outside church to collect blankets or adult size jackets or warm clothing
- Send a card or call someone you know will be alone for the holidays.
- St. Raymond Homeless Family Fund: to help a family with gifts for the holiday, contact HFF@straymondmp.org.
