



We Pray - Praise be to you, my Lord (Laudato si', mi Signore). Thank you for the wonderful gift of the earth you have given us. Please help us to love, enjoy, and care for our common home.

We Reflect - A Gratitude Walk - What Can I See Today?

This begins with an experience which made me appreciate the gift of sight more than I had before. Though it happened several years ago, when I remember, love and wonder still fill my heart. I was a Eucharistic Minister to the Homebound at my parish. Rose was very sweet, in her 90s, and blind. She asked me if she could see me before we had our service. Being a little confused, I told her it was up to God, if she would suddenly see. She gently laughed and asked again. I knelt on the ground by her chair and asked what she had in mind. She wanted to feel my face, so she could imagine what I looked like. As I said yes she oh, so gently, felt my face while asking me the color of my hair and eyes. I asked if I could see her in the same way. She began to cry that someone would care enough to want to experience sight as she did. That day we saw each other in a new way with our hands and our hearts. God did want us to see each other before our Eucharistic service, beginning a long time of being in communion. Walking out to my car, I saw the world with different eyes.

We Act - What does this have to do with you and with walking? Please think about the wonder of this gift of sight given to us- through both our eyes and our hearts. The challenge for you today whether you see with your own eyes or through someone else's: on your walk, whether around your yard, your block, or for miles (wear your mask, take water...), use your eyes to appreciate the world. What do you see? Shapes, colors, flowers, birds, trees, animals, people? Can you find five things of beauty, of awe, of wonder? Gifts from God that you are thankful for? You might want to take a photo or draw a picture to share with someone; either at your home or someone you would like to be with but cannot be right now.
