Join us as we Zoom into RCIA

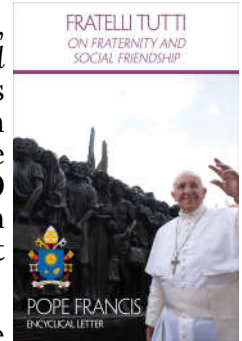

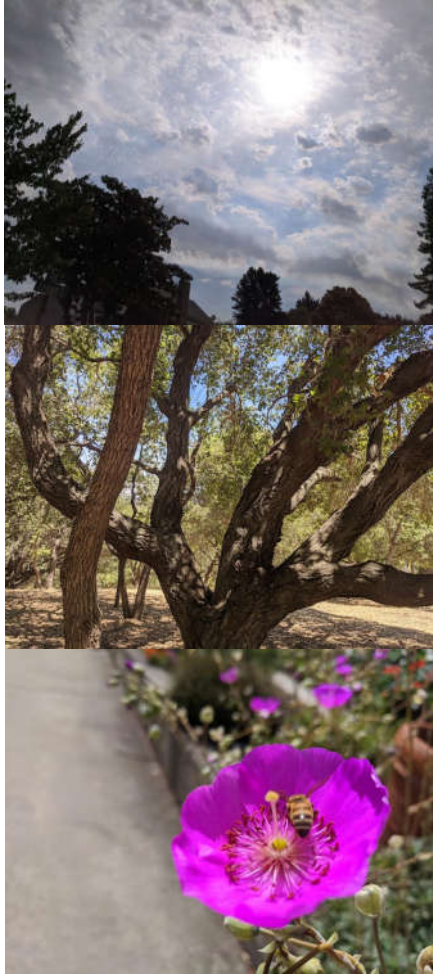

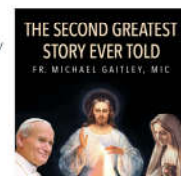
