FAITH FORMATION

THE WHAT, HOW, AND WHY OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

Pope Francis, after reciting a live streamed Angelus prayer, told people on March 15, 2020, "United to Christ we are never alone, but instead form one body, of which he is the head. It is a union that is nourished with prayer and also with spiritual communion in the Eucharist, a practice that is recommended when it isn't possible to receive the sacrament." With the onset of COVID-19, we can imagine that Pope Francis suspected Catholics may not be able to receive Communion for some time and wanted to remind us of and offer us a way that we can continue to be united and "in communion" with Jesus.

The history of spiritual communion in the Church goes back to its early centuries, with the fifth-century bishop St. Augustine extolling the value of spiritual communion in his homilies and later saints, like the 16th-century reformer and mystic St. Theresa of Avila, advising that through making a spiritual communion "the love of God will be greatly impressed on you." In days past, geography, work, caring for children, and illness were just a few of the things that may have prevented Catholics from being able to receive the Eucharist regularly. While it is widely available in most parts of the United States today, there continue to be countries where a shortage of priests, parishes that are far from urban areas, violence, and other challenging life circumstances, cause people to be unable to receive the Eucharist on a regular basis. In these countries, there is a true need for practicing spiritual communion.

What most people are asking these days is.... What is spiritual communion?

And how do I do it?

St. Thomas Aquinas described it as "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the most holy sacrament and lovingly embrace him" at a time or in circumstances when we cannot receive him in sacramental Communion. He goes on to say that spiritual communion needs no special instruction; it only requires the same disposition as the actual reception of the sacrament and turning to Jesus with an open heart.

Fr. Michael Hurley, OP of St. Dominic's Parish in San Francisco suggests there are five steps for making a spiritual communion when we are unable to attend Mass in person. The steps are as follows:

1) Create Space in Yourself to Receive Jesus

Take a few moments to be quiet and still and to center yourself and free yourself from distractions. Invite God to come into this space and to be with you.

2) Make an Act of Faith

This means telling God that you believe in Him and entrust your heart and your life to Him. You can do this quietly to yourself and say the prayer we say in Mass as preparation to receive the Eucharist: "Lord, I am not worthy

to receive you, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed." (Matthew 8:8)

3) Make an Act of Love

In this step, we offer ourselves to God and promise to share God's love with others. We can say something like: "God, I offer myself to you, help me to be your presence to others and to share your love with them through my own thoughts and actions." We can pray this generally for our interactions with all, or we can be specific and offer to be loving to a certain person or in a specific situation.

4) Invite God to Open the Door of Your Heart

Invite God to do just this... open the door of your heart. Recognize in this moment that God wants to nourish and feed us with his love and care. Close your eyes and allow the presence of Jesus to come into your mind and heart, almost as if you were receiving his body and blood at Mass. Take your time in this step and allow yourself to feel Jesus' presence in you and with you.

(Fr. Michael does not refer to the Spiritual Communion Prayer in his video, but the end of step 4 can be a good place to say it if you've gotten into the habit and want to continue).

5) A Moment of Gratitude

Keep this simple....Take a moment to thank God for the gift of your life and for all that He has given you. Thank Him for the gift of his Son and for the chance to allow Him to be with you today. Allow yourself a few moments to feel the gratitude well up in you.

I don't know about you, but there are times I take receiving Communion on Sundays and during the week for granted. While I hope we are all back in Church together again one day in future, the spiritual communion prayer has made me aware once again of Jesus' presence in my life and my ever present need to stay connected, "in communion" with Him. While it may take us some time to get used to this prayer and may feel strange, especially when we first begin, we can give it a chance, asking God as we do in all things, to be with us, to show us the way and to give us strength for the journey we're on. We may just find that like Teresa of Avila, "the love of God will be greatly impressed on us."




