HOMELESS FAMILY FUND

We are the verge of what could be the largest humanitarian crisis the Bay Area has ever experienced. On January 31, 2021, the moratorium on evictions will no longer be in place. For those households who have not paid at least 25% of what they owe in back rent, effective February 1st, they will be homeless and out on the street.

St. Raymond Parish and THIS Fund are working to ensure that doesn't happen. Every dollar you give will ensure families stay safe during this crisis by maintaining stable housing and keeping kids out of shelters. On average, rent in East Palo Alto for a 1 bedroom (usually in a shared house) runs approximately \$1,400 to \$2,600 a month.

Please consider making a reoccurring monthly e-donation or a large lump sum to help support the ongoing need. In the last two weeks, we were able to cover the need of 24 more families with individual generous donations of \$1,000, \$5,000, \$15,000 and a bequest of \$88,000.

What has St. Raymond supported to date?

- Disbursed \$175,953.43 to cover rental assistance for the current month; and, for those that who were in arrears due to unemployment from COVID-19 and other reason
 - unemployment from COVID-19 and other reasons, we have brought them up to date;
- Prevented 44 households (including 61 adults and 75 children) from being evicted; and
- Provided, through Catholic Charities, **just-in-time information referrals** to other services and benefits within the San Mateo County system including CalFresh, Legal Aid, and employment.

In responding to the signs of the times, the Homeless Family Fund at St. Raymond Parish is partnering with Catholic Charities San Mateo and St. Francis of Assisi Parish in East Palo Alto to identify individuals and families in need of support to cover basic necessities and to provide information referrals to other services and opportunities in the County.

SPECIAL COLLECTIONS SCHEDULE

Sunday, Dec. 13-Retirement for Religious

Donations for special collections will be accepted in the collection basket at our Masses and online at straymondmp.org/donate/. In March 2020, a single mother with 3 dependent children (19 years old, 12 years old and 5 years old) lost her job and income working as a dishwasher at a local pizza restaurant in downtown Menlo Park. In April, she contracted COVID-19 and subsequently gave it to her children. She and her three children live in a small studio with 1 bathroom, where the youngest two are engaged in distance learning.

After exhausting all of her savings and asking her oldest son to stop his schooling and give the tuition money toward rent, she came to Fr. Goode for support. He referred her to the St. Raymond Homeless Family Fund, which was able to provide \$6,000 in rental assistance, covering her two months in arrears and the month of November. Catholic Charities also worked with the family to access other services in the county.

The applicant, a single 54-year old woman, was at the risk of eviction for non-payment of rent since June 2020. In April 2020, she lost her employment (cleaning homes) due to the COVID-19 pandemic. In July 2020, she was also the victim of assault, suffered a major concussion, and was robbed of many of her personable valuables, including her remaining savings which she had in cash.

In October 2020, St. Vincent de Paul agreed to put forth \$1,200, Samaritan House agreed to put forth \$1,200, and the Homeless Family Fund was able to provide the remaining \$4,200 to cover her rent in arrears from mid-June through October and the month of November. Since then, with the support of Fr. Goode, she has been able to find work again for those in the community.

2ND SUNDAY OF ADVENT - MARK 1:1-18

John the Baptist is the focus of today's Gospel, as we clearly see his attitude of self-denial and humility. People from all over Judea and Jerusalem come to John. He is humble and is totally focused on calling everyone to the baptism of repentance for forgiveness and to prepare the way for Jesus.

John heralds the coming of God's Kingdom and the need for us to respond with a complete

change of heart. He calls us to be selfless, willing to decrease so the Lord, Himself, may increase.

Deep belief in God and His saving grace through Jesus, along with the incredible gift of our earth, should make us all deeply grateful and



humble. Pope Francis hopes our recognition of this great gift will "move people to care for the environment of which they are a part, [and] Christians in their turn realize that their responsibility within creation, and their duty towards nature and the Creator, are an essential part of their faith." (Laudato Si' 64)
