

Let us pray that politicians, scientists and economists work together to protect the world's seas and oceans.

Concerned by the state of the planet's water supply and the living creatures within it, Pope Francis has asked Catholics to pray and take action so that politicians, scientists, and economists work together to establish protective measures. In December 2017, about 200 nations agreed to limit plastic pollution of the oceans, warning that the amount of such material could outweigh fish by 2030. (UN data shows 8 million tons of plastic enter the ocean annually, killing marine life and feeding into the human food chain.)

In his message on the fourth World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation in 2018, Francis said, "We cannot allow our seas and oceans to be littered by endless fields of floating plastic."

"We need to pray as if everything depended on God's providence, and work as if everything depended on us," he said. https://youtu.be/LmLZb7 cWV4





Thinking of oceans and seas also led the pope to think of the thousands of migrants and refugees who "risk their lives at sea in search of a better future." 


