

Grace and peace of Christ be with you.



This community is overjoyed and excited that our brothers and sisters at St. Raymond Parish have reached out in this kind and compassionate gesture to assist us during this covid-19 crisis. We are deeply grateful. And Scripture sums up our thought for you as it says: "The generous will themselves be blessed, for they share their food with the poor." (Proverbs 22:9)

This gift is truly a lifesaver as the pandemic has created untold hardship in the lives of many of my parishioners. The lockdown has meant that many who could no longer engage in their farming or small business in order to sustain their families. As a result many are no longer able to send their children back to school or enroll to learn a new skill. We thank God that things are beginning to open up and return to some form of normalcy, but the after effects of the long period of the lockdown is still being felt in our community. So you can see why we are excited and joyful about this generous donation.

We intend to use the funds to provide for scholarships for your boys and girls especially of very poor families. We intend to start with 2 girls and 2 boys in High School. Some of your donation will also be used to provide training to acquire new skills for some young women and men. This will help them be independent and able to take care of their basic family needs. We will also use part of the money to buy medicines especially multi vitamins, pains medications and some first aid to the needy among us.

Once we receive the money I will send you more detailed information of how the money is being used with pictures and testimonies of the parishioners. Thanks so much for your generosity. May the Lord bless and reward you abundantly.

WHAT IS THE STATE OF YOUR SOIL?

Have you decided if you are going to start home composting or add something pre-prepared? Do you have a spot of soil you've decided to plant in? Have you churned the soil so it can get nutrients and be enriched?

How is your "soul soil" coming? Have you gotten a chance to begin Lenten practices, to see how God wants to churn the soil of your soul so you can get nutrients and be enriched? God will speak to you in your own special way. Just like we might add missing minerals to the soil for different needs, so too reading, praying, and listening to different things tends our soul soil.

The soil has been prepared. Have you gotten a chance to plant a seed or put a seedling in the ground? For your soul, that might mean continuing with something you tried last week, or you might still be looking for what 'seed' will work for you, what might 'grow you'. You might try franciscan-spirit-blog/lent-with-st-francis-take-up-your-cross or ignatiansolidarity.net/steadfast-lent-2021/. Please feed your soul. So too your soil.

In your soil, you have a couple of options regarding what seed to put in also. If you choose food, pick something you enjoy eating and fits the season. Many online sites list what grows each time of the year. See garden.org/apps/calendar/?q=94025 or commongroundinpaloalto.org/planting-calendar/.

If you are planting for beauty instead of food, try native plantings. Grass may be lovely, but takes a lot of water while not feeding wildlife or absorbing carbon or other damaging things from the air. Native plants require less water, and they are what the birds, insects and animals in an area naturally desire. To find native plant suggestions go to audubon.org/native-plants.

Enjoy what is around you - look, plant if you can, feed your soul soil, continue to 'Lent along' as you prepare for Easter's Resurrection.
