



## SAINT OF THE WEEK

## St. Maria Goretti

FEAST: JULY 6

of the largest One crowds ever assembled canonizationfor а 250,000-symbolized the reaction of millions touched by the simple story of Maria Goretti. She was the daughter of a poor Italian tenant farmer, had no chance to go to school, never learned to read or write. When Maria made her First Communion not long before her death, she was one of the larger and somewhat backward members of the class.

On a hot afternoon in July, Maria was sitting at the top of the stairs of her house, mending a shirt. She was not quite old, but years physically mature. A cart stopped outside, and a neighbor, 18-year-old Alessandro, ran up the stairs. He seized her and pulled into her bedroom. She struggled and tried to call for help. "No. God does not wish it," she cried out. "It is a sin. You would go to hell for it." Alessandro began

striking at her blindly with a long dagger.

Maria was taken to a hospital. Her last hours were marked by the usual simple compassion of the good—concern about where her mother would sleep, forgiveness of her murderer (she had been in fear of him, but did not say anything lest she cause trouble to his family), and her devout welcoming of Viaticum, her last Holy Communion. She died about 24 hours after the attack.

Alessandro was sentenced to 30 years in prison. For a long time he was unrepentant and surly. One night he had a dream or vision of Maria gathering flowers and offering them to him. His life changed. When he was released after 27 years, his first act was to beg the forgiveness of Maria's mother.

Devotion to the young martyr grew, miracles were worked, and in less than half a century she was canonized. At her beatification in 1947, her 82-year-old mother, two sisters, and her brother appeared with Pope Pius XII on the balcony of St. Peter's. Three years later, at Maria's canonization, a 66-year-old Alessandro Serenelli knelt among the quarter-million people and cried tears of joy.

At a May 25<sup>th</sup> press conference, the Vatican Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development introduced the seven-year long *Laudato Si'* Action Platform, laudatosiactionplatform.org. This platform outlines seven categories of sustainability goals in the spirit of Pope Francis' 2015 encyclical, *Laudato Si'*, on *Care for Our Common Home*. The goals include:

- Adopting renewable energy;
- Achieving carbon neutrality;
- Defending all life;
- Solidarity with Indigenous peoples and vulnerable groups;
- Adopting simpler lifestyles;
- Fostering ecological education and spirituality;
- Advocating for sustainable development.


The platform suggests goals for families, parishes and dioceses, schools and universities, businesses and farms, religious congregations, and hospitals and other health care facilities.

One big step St. Raymond Parish can do is convert to solar power to fill its energy needs. Fr. Jerome has asked the Laudato Si' group to spearhead a project to install solar panels to supply the energy for church, parish center, school, and priests' residence, in order to access "clean energy, not dirty energy." We are currently consulting with two agencies that work with church communities to determine feasibility and develop a plan to adopt solar energy. We ask the St. Raymond community to join us, especially anyone who has knowledge and experience at any level of conversion to solar.
