

St. Raymond is blessed to have Neri Miranda as our new Director of Faith Formation, who leads the Religious Education program and the Youth Ministry.

She is very enthusiastic to form the Youth Ministry of our parish, and she recently started the Youth Jam, which is a social event with values formation for youth. Last August we had "Chips and Dips: Dip Into Our Faith" and "Lemon" Sunday: Brighten Your Life".

She is lining up numerous events and activities for our youth; with that, we need to upgrade our youth center facilities and electronics.



In today's Gospel, Jesus rejects the competition and

rivalry of his disciples for positions of power and prestige, and instead embraces a child as the example of how to be Christ-like in the world. Two things that children and the Earth have in common: vulnerability and innocence.



FOR OUR COMMON HOME

Children are vulnerable to many

dangers in the world. They inspire our protective instincts to keep them safe and free from harm. The Earth also needs to be protected from the results of climate change that lead to everything from drought and wildfires to hurricanes and flooding.

Children have an innocence that adults have lost. Children want what is good: things like peace,

harmony, better relationships, and less harm. Whereas (not unlike Jesus' disciples), many adults value power over service, which is endangering our planet and many plant and animal species.


