6 MONTH OF THE ROSARY

HAIL MARY: OUR BATTLE CRY

As Catholics, we take up our battle cry of the “Hail Mary”¹ in this month of the Rosary. The feast of our Lady of the Rosary on October 7th marks the anniversary of the victory of the Holy League over the Ottoman Forces at the Battle of Lepanto in 1571². Records of the battle illustrate an outnumbered Christian force obliterating the grander Ottoman fleet.

Some estimates calculate the Ottoman losses to nearly four times the number casualties and ten times the number of ships than that of the Christian fleet³. The Dominican Saint, Pope Pius V, helped to assemble the Christian army, materially and spiritually in the face of the Ottoman threat. Pope Pius V ordered the churches of Rome to be opened day and night and encouraged the faithful to pray the Rosary and ask for

Mary’s intercession. Pius V, who attributed the success to Mother Mary’s intercession, instituted the Feast of our Lady of Victory upon learning that the Christian forces had been victorious. Eventually Pope Pius X in 1913, changed the feast as we know it today to Our Lady of the Rosary on October 7th.

But what significance does this military victory from centuries ago have for us today? We must note that had the Christian forces not been victorious, Europe would look very different today and probably much less Christian. But divine intervention for military endeavors is nothing new. We can recall the biblical precedence of heroines interceding in times of distress: Deborah (Judges 4-5), Rahab (Joshua 2), and Judith (Book of Judith) who through their own acts of faith saved their people from destruction.

Though a militaristic outlook seems to be against

our modern Christian sensibilities, our cry of Hail Mary, is no less a call to arms. When we contemplate the words of the Hail Mary and recite her Rosary faithfully and prayerfully, we let ourselves be drawn into the great mystery of God and the Word made flesh. Our souls and spirits expand as we meditate on the mystery of the incarnation, we institute a spiritual rallying forth and cleave to Christ and His Church. It is not possible to ponder the mysteries of God-made-man without the great Mother of God. Just as Jesus Christ was fully God and fully man, we are material creatures who are also heirs to His divine inheritance. As Paul VI writes in his apostolic exhortation, *Marialis Cultus*:

“The Church’s reflection today on the mystery of Christ and on her own nature has led her to find at the root of the former and is a culmination of the latter the same figure of a woman: the Virgin Mary, the Mother of Christ and the Mother of the Church⁴.”

Just as St. Dominic was told to preach Our Lady’s Psalter so should we reflect and imitate the profound

mysteries of Christ’s life with the Rosary so that “all nations will know your saving help” (Ps 67:3).

In this month of the Rosary, let us take the Hail Mary as our battle cry, steeling ourselves before the trials of the world, and also to ask to be given the graces to endure the trials of our time. Some particular action items for this month could be to renew our fervor to pray the Rosary. Or to commit to memorizing and praying the dedicated mysteries of the Rosary. Or even to invite others to pray our Lady’s Rosary together. From this fount of prayer, we can share the fruits of our contemplation with the words of Paul VI, putting our faith into action:

“The disciple who builds up the earthly and temporal city while being a diligent pilgrim towards the heavenly and eternal city; the disciple who works for that justice which sets free the

oppressed and for that charity which assists the needy; but above all, the disciple who is the active witness of that love which builds up Christ in people's hearts."⁵

As we pray and preach the good news of the Gospel, let us all pray Hail Mary, hoping beyond hope for the joy of the Resurrection and life eternal, remembering as the Baltimore Catechism taught that God made us to know, love, serve Him in this life and to be happy with Him in the next. Let us use the battle cry of our Lady to march forth in hope and confidence, keeping the words of Mary's Magnificat on our lips: "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, My spirit rejoices in God my savior!" (Luke 1:46-47) Hail Mary!
