IS GOD ABOVE THE LAW?

TUESDAY, JUNE 7 @ 7 PM

Is the natural law objective and immutable, or can God overrule it whenever he pleases? If the natural law is objective and immutable, what should we

make of God's commanding Abraham to kill Isaac? And why is God "allowed" to inflict evils on us that the natural law forbids us to inflict on each other? — In this talk we will discuss Thomistic answers to these and related questions. By doing so, we will hopefully get



clearer on how Christianity can provide a genuinely objective alternative to secular moral subjectivism, rather than simply replacing it with a kind of divine moral subjectivism. We will also be better equipped to respond to the "problem of evil" objection against God's existence.

Dr. Francis Feingold is Associate Professor of Philosophy at St. Patrick's Seminary & University, where he has taught for the last four years. He did his undergraduate studies at Christendom College, and received his PhD in Philosophy from the Catholic University of America in 2018. His dissertation addressed the problem of divine impassibility: how God can be perfectly happy despite the moral self-destruction of the sinners he loves. His specialization is in the thought of St. Thomas Aquinas, especially his metaphysics and ethics.

May the power and the light of the grace we have received also be evident in our relationship to other creatures and to the world around us. (LS.221)

On this Feast of the Ascension of the Lord, we commemorate Jesus' return to the Father, knowing that his work of salvation had to continue "not only in this age but also in the one to come".

He knew that the Father put all things under his feet – the ones that walked the earth – making Jesus "king over all the earth," and also the head of his earthly body, the church.

Now, we are that body of Christ on earth. His work was not complete, so Jesus commissioned his disciples - and us - to be witnesses to all we have seen and heard, even to the ends of the earth. The Father entrusted God's people and all creation to Jesus, and Jesus has entrusted that charge to us. We are called to keep our focus on the needs of all creation, starting with people, the children of God, and of earth - our common home. As Pope Francis put it in Laudato Si', we have been given the power and light of grace, as Jesus and the Holy Spirit invite us to embrace the world in a way that will bring a renewal of humanity, planet earth, even the universe. Christ's work is still unfolding. He guides us but we, as members of Christ's church, are responsible for caring for all of creation.

By now you may have seen the proposals for renovation of the Church and Arbor House (priests' residence.) The vision of the Santa Cruz Avenue frontage will open up our church and grounds to the neighborhood, in "clear witness to all we have seen and heard." We are especially excited that these



renovations include solar panels, a clear indication of our commitment to sustainable energy, a sign to the community that we want to be good stewards of our environment.

The Laudato Si' group here at St. Raymond began investigating the installation of solar panels back in 2020, contacting various agencies that have been instrumental in helping parishes around the country discern the move to solar-powered energy systems for churches, schools, convents and rectories. We urge you to attend the "town hall meeting" on June 9 to learn more about the entire renovation plan.

Let us pray that our decisions will reflect our awareness that we are united with all of creation, and that we are also its caretakers, let us pray to the Lord....
