



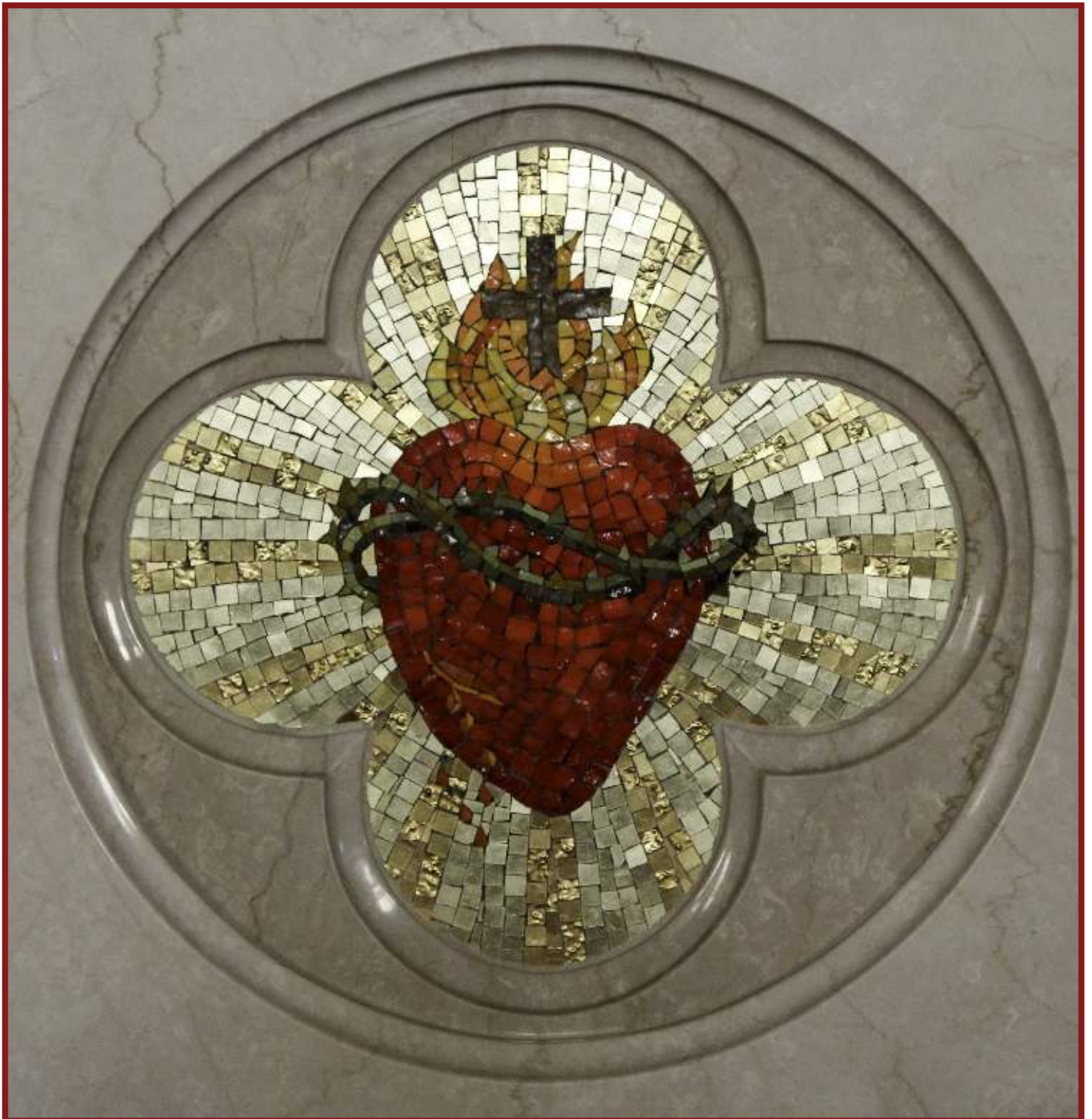

The Christian has a sure and steadfast anchor of his soul, despite the uncertainty and struggles of life, for his hope is not placed in the things of earth but in the unchanging and unfailing mercy of God. Join us for a discussion of Jesus as the source of our hope, and learn practical ways to grow in Christian hope in our trying times.

Dr. Jeffrey Froula is Associate Professor and Chair of the Moral Theology Department at St. Patrick's Seminary and University in Menlo Park. One of his primary research interests is the importance of hope in the Christian life. He resides in Fremont with his wife and three young boys.

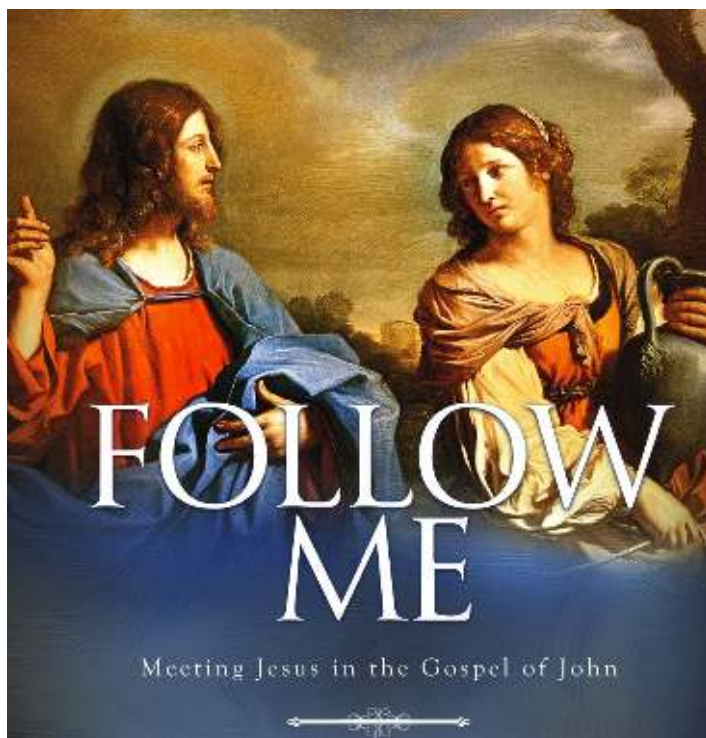

YOU SHALL LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR AS YOURSELF

What does this commandment mean in the context of the global climate crisis? How do our actions and practices affect the lives of “our neighbor?”

Pope Francis suggests care for the environment is vital to caring for each other.

We have to realize that a true ecological approach always becomes a social approach; it must integrate questions of justice in debates on the environment, so as to hear both the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor. (LS49)

He urges us to see the presence of God in all creation and to view all creation and all creatures with reverence. *Each creature reflects something of God and has a message to convey to us ... God created the world, writing into it an order and a dynamism that human beings have no right to ignore. (LS221)* In this month dedicated to recognizing the beauty and majesty of the oceans, let us thank God for the vibrant colors of the ocean waters, for the shimmering sparkle of the sun through the waves, and for all the life that thrives beneath the surface and helps to sustain us.

We also need to be mindful that the warming of Earth’s oceans and atmosphere leads to both severe drought and flooding in different areas. The changes in the ocean waters affect the creatures who live there, and the most vulnerable people, our neighbors, who are most at risk.

Holy Spirit, help us to see that even the smallest

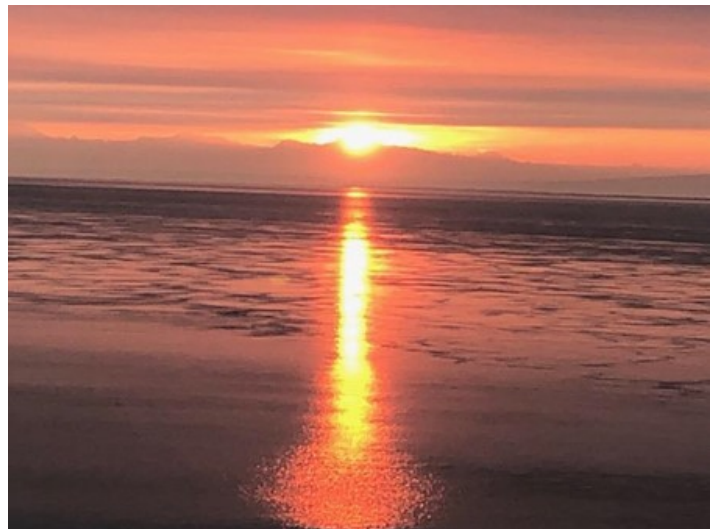
actions we take show our obedience to your command to “love our neighbor.”
