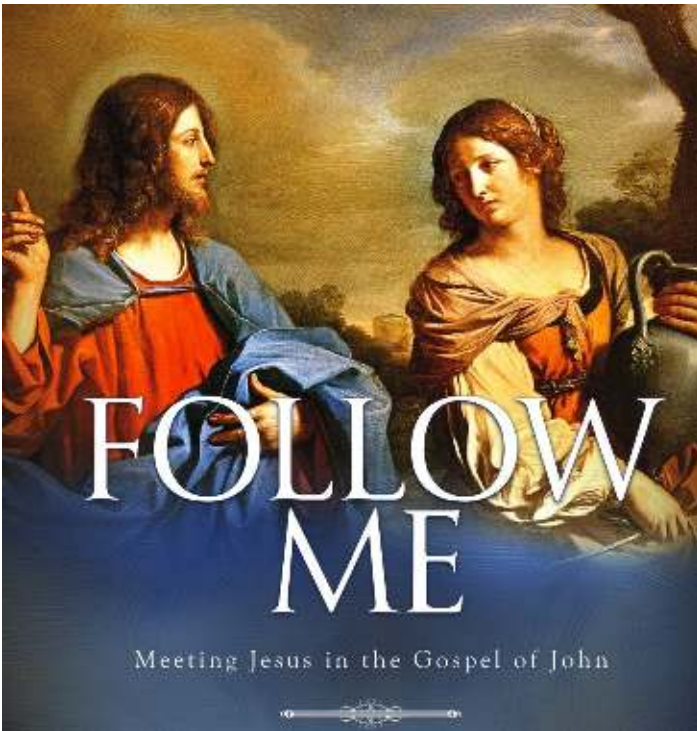


ON THE COVER— We welcome Reilly Payne to our Parish Family. She was baptized at the 10 am Mass on Sunday, June 26, 2022.

Congratulations to the newly ordained friars of the Western Dominican Providence Fr. Joshua Gatus, OP, Fr. Joseph Selinger, OP, and Fr. Matthew Heynen, OP. They were ordained to the priesthood by Bishop Robert Barron, Bishop-Designate of the Diocese of Winona-Rochester and founder of Word on Fire Ministries.



Pier Giorgio Frassati was born on April 6, 1901 in Turin, Italy to a family of political and social means. He attended the university of Turin as an engineering student. Giorgio was a popular student, a known social activist, and a servant to the poor and oppressed in fascist Italy. He joined the Dominican Order as a layman on May 28, 1922. He was known for his commitment to prayer and study, his devotion to the Blessed Sacrament, and a tender love of the Blessed Mother. He died on July 4, 1925 of polio and was beatified May 20, 1990. He was given the title “Man of the Beatitudes” by Pope John Paul II at his beatification.

As happens with greater frequency, summertime turns our thoughts to drought. What can we do to help with such a big problem?

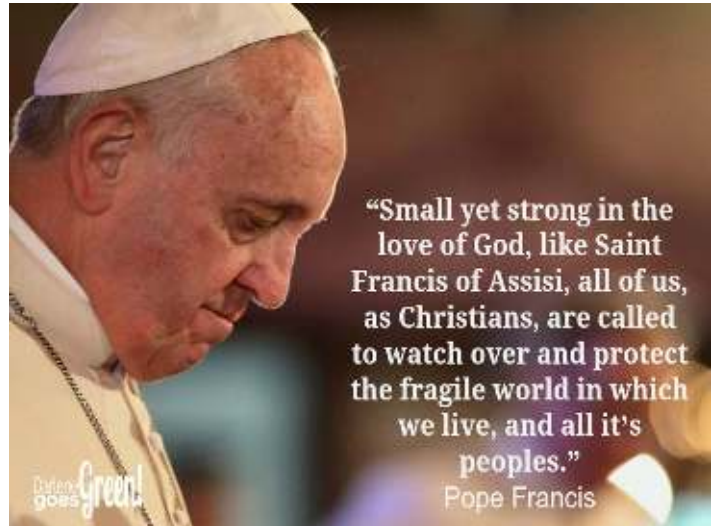
We really can make a difference.

Indoor: Fix leaky faucets; take shorter showers; run dishwasher as full as possible (without running out

of dishes) and full laundry loads; turn off water while brushing your teeth.

Outdoor: move towards drought resistant plants; set timers for your irrigation systems and only water at night or in the coolest parts of the day; use a broom to sweep your driveway or sidewalk or patios, not a hose.
