



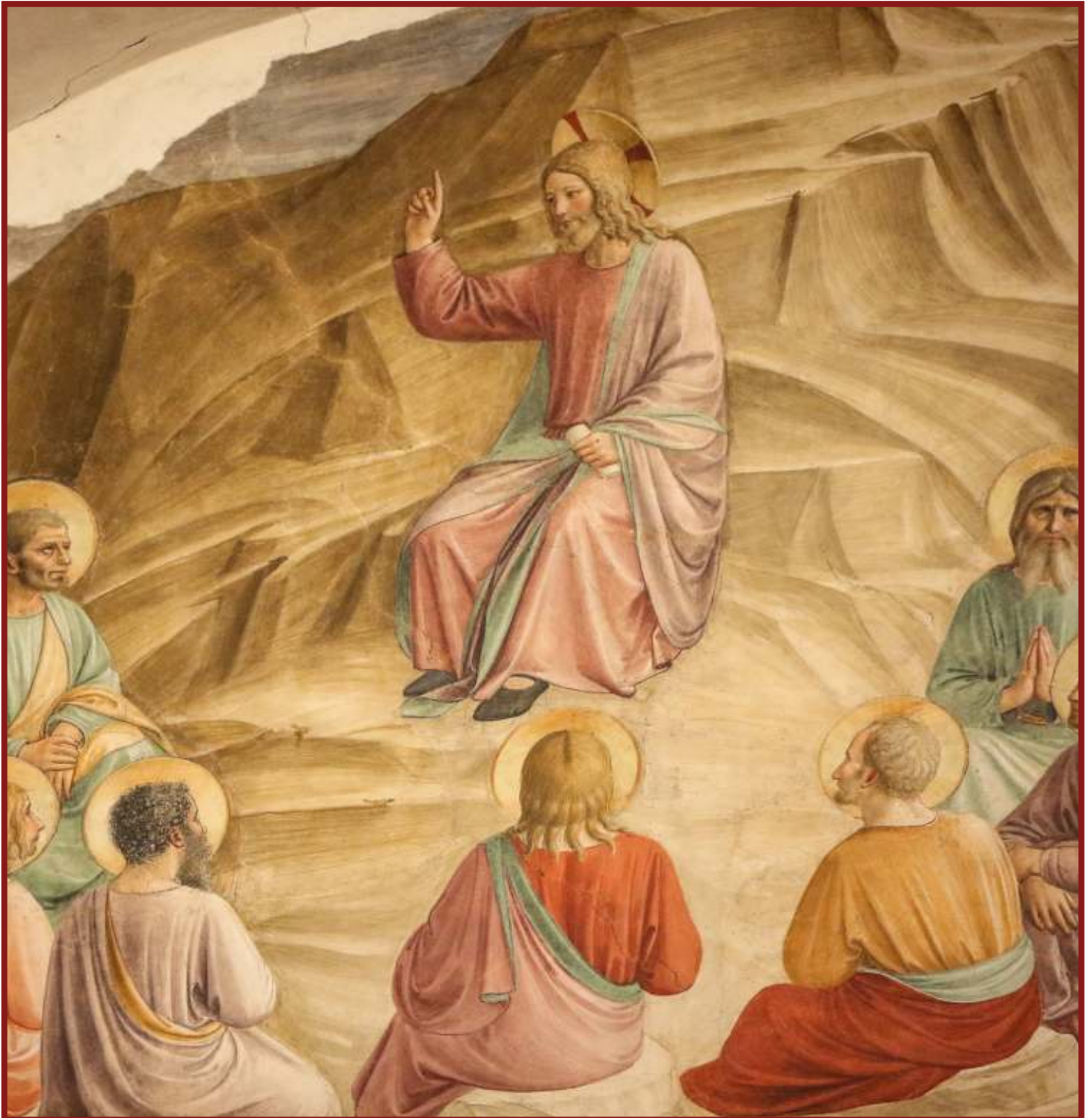

CONTEMPLATIVE PRAYER IN THE CATHOLIC SPIRITUAL TRADITION

TUESDAY, JULY 26 @ 7 PM IN CHAPEL

Is it possible to live at the pace of prayer in our post-modern milieu? St. Elisabeth of the Trinity, a Carmelite mystic at the dawn of the 20th Century, believed that God's abiding presence should be at the center of everyone's life, including parents and families. To this end, she proposed to her sister, a young mother, a way of life rooted in contemplative prayer. This presentation describes this kind of prayer and how to live it drawing from the same Biblical sources that she used.

Dr. Anthony Lilles is a professor of theology at St. Patrick's Seminary and University in Menlo Park. Teaching spiritual theology for over twenty-five years in Denver and



Los Angeles, he is an expert in Carmelite mysticism who studied at Franciscan University in Steubenville, Ohio, completing his graduate and post graduate work at the University of St. Thomas in Rome. He podcasts at DiscerningHearts.com and his meditations are published at SpiritualDirection.com. There will be a potluck before the Speaker Series—details below.

MARYKNOLL SISTERS

On the weekend of July 30 & 31, we will be visited by **Sister Arlene Trant** of the Maryknoll Sisters of St. Dominic. She will be sharing her mission experiences with you.



Maryknoll is a missionary community. The Sisters serve in 24 countries around the world.

Sister Arlene was assigned to the China Region in 1973 and lived and worked in Hong Kong and Macau. Her main ministry was with the Deaf. In 1998 she was assigned to Guatemala where she lived in a poor barrio on the outskirts of Guatemala City. Sister's ministry there included work with a women's cooperative and on weekends with the Deaf Catholic Community.

In 2004, Sister Arlene returned from Guatemala and for four years was involved in the Maryknoll Sisters' Vocation Ministry. In 2008, she returned to the China Region, where she lived in Macau and worked as a sign language interpreter as well as in Pastoral Ministry with the Deaf.

Sister will be available after Mass to talk with anyone who wants to know more about her missionary work and that of the Maryknoll Sisters.

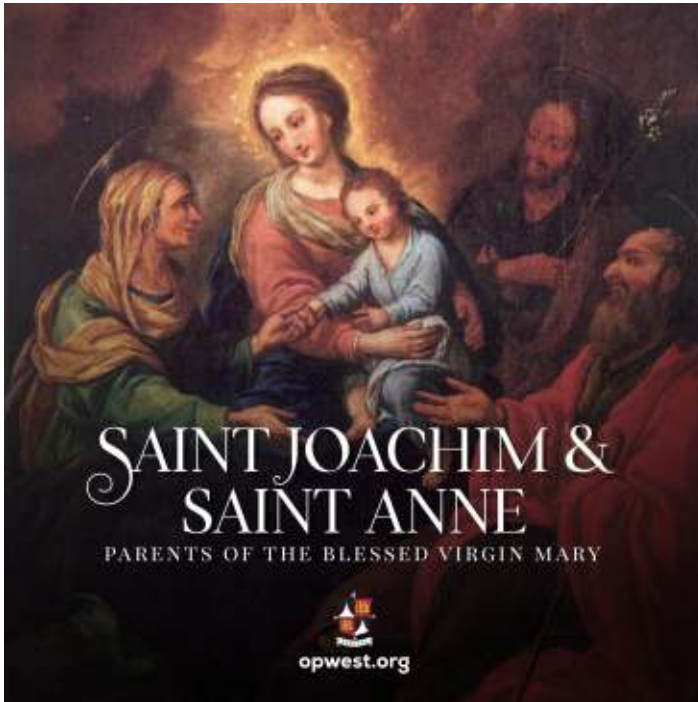
5TH SUNDAY COLLECTION AUGUST 6-7

Saints of the Week



STS. JOACHIM & ANNE (JULY 26)

On July 26, the Feast Day of St. Anne and St. Joachim, we honor the lives of Mary's parents, the earthly grandparents of Jesus. As existing information about Saints Anne and Joachim comes from the Gospel of James and Catholic legend, there is debate over the details of their lives. But regardless, it can be agreed that to be the parents of Jesus's earthly mother, Saint Anne and Saint Joachim must have been faithful, devoted parents indeed. The patronage of Saint Anne includes grandparents, couples without children, women in labor, and women unable to conceive. Likewise, Saint Joachim is considered the patron of grandfathers, fathers, and grandparents.

Anne, in Hebrew, means "God has given grace." According to existing accounts, she was barren for much of her life. One day in her advanced years, she conceived Mary, the mother of Jesus. Saint Anne dedicated the life of her child to the service of God when she was only three – a decision that was undoubtedly formative in the shaping of the future Mother of God.

Pope Francis remarked of Saints Anne and Joachim:

In their home, Mary came into the world, accompanied by the extraordinary mystery of the Immaculate Conception. Mary grew up in the home of Joachim and Anne; she was surrounded

by their love and faith: in their home she learned to listen to the Lord and to follow his will. Saints Joachim and Anne were part of a long chain of people who had transmitted their faith and love for God, expressed in the warmth and love of family life, down to Mary, who received the Son of God in her womb and who gave him to the world, to us. How precious is the family as the privileged place for transmitting the faith!
