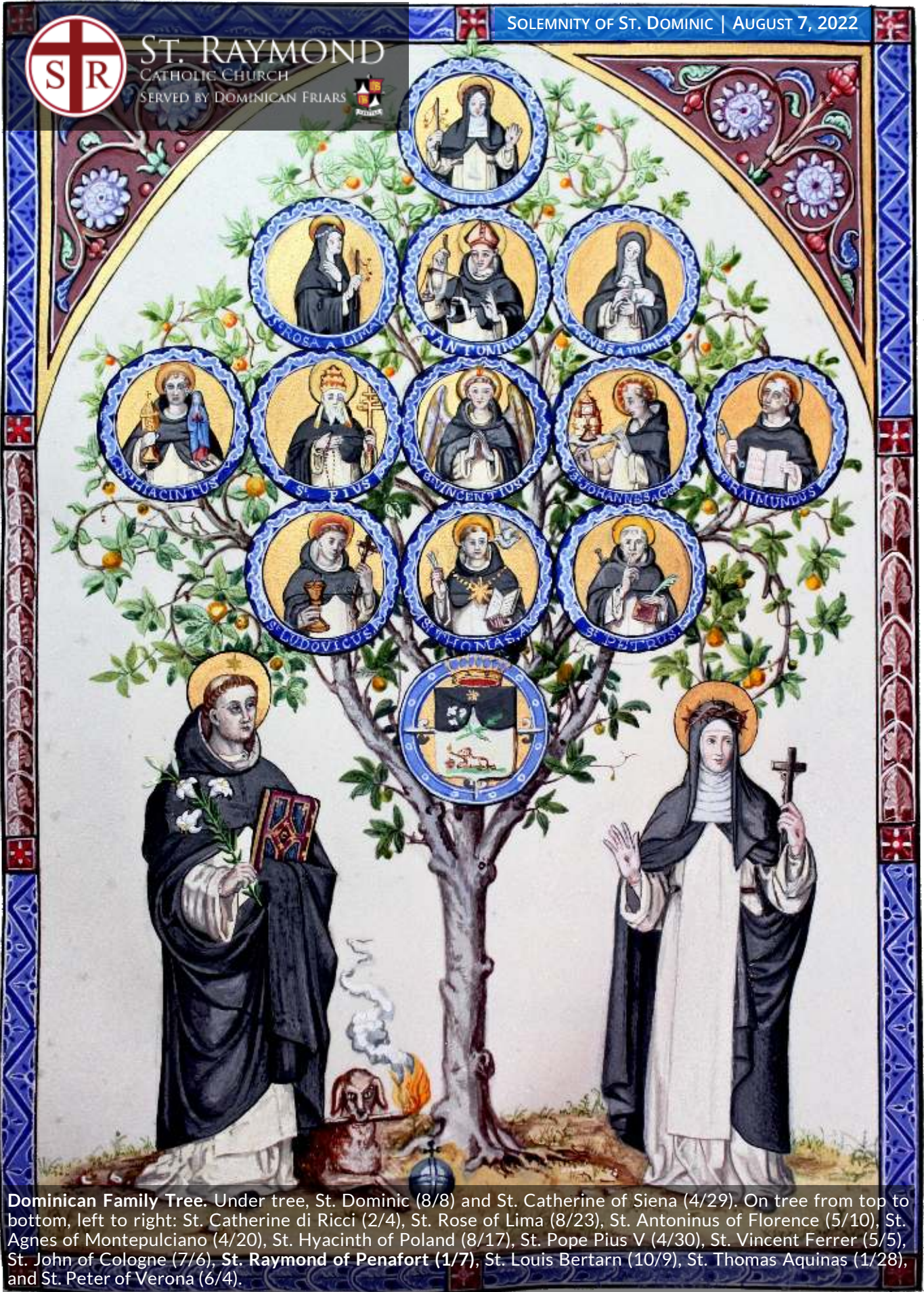

WITH FR. JAMES MOORE, O.P., PHD

THURSDAY, AUGUST 18, 7:15 PM, CHAPEL

Come and learn about the spirituality of the Dominican order. Dominican spirituality is theocentric, Christological, contemplative, monastic, priestly, apostolic, and doctrinal. Its first five qualities are common, but the apostolic and doctrinal



character of Dominican spirituality is unique and specific among the various strands of Catholic spirituality. Dominican contemplation seeks to sanctify the individual and also to bear fruit in the apostolate, especially through preaching, teaching, and writing. Bring all your questions about the Dominicans since we've arrived at St. Raymond and Fr. James will be happy to share his expertise.

Fr. James was born in Coalinga, California and was ordained to the priesthood in 2008. A graduate cum laude of Santa Clara University in California, majoring in music, Fr. James earned his Master's degree in music from the University of Notre Dame in 2000, and his doctorate in Musical Arts (DMA) from the Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C. in 2015. He now serves as the Vicar Provincial for Advancement for the Western Dominican Province.

This weekend we welcome **Fr. Timothy Conlan, O.P.** He last visited St. Raymond in 2018.

Fr. Tim grew up in San Francisco, studied at U.C. Davis and S.F. State College, entered the Dominican Order in 1960, and was ordained in 1967. He began his pastoral ministry in 1970 in Seattle, followed by assignments in San Francisco, Berkeley, and Anchorage. In 1981 he began working as the "Director of Social Justice and Continuing Education" for the Western Dominican Province. After a sabbatical in Peru and Central America in 1986, he ministered for four years at our parish of Santa Maria de Guadalupe in Mexicali. In 1991-92 he served in Guatemala, in the city and surrounding villages of Rabinal. In 1998, he requested to return, and remains there to this day.

Luke 12:35, 43 "Be like servants who await their master's return from a wedding...Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival."

Reflect

Jesus' exhortation to his disciples – and to us: Don't worry about what we possess, but put our energies towards an inexhaustible treasure in heaven. He says we must "Be prepared" for the master's return and live our lives trying to do God's will so we will be found to be His faithful servants.

Act

We are cautioned not to put off our duty, thinking that we will have time to accomplish it later. And how do we prepare for the master's arrival? By faithfully carrying out our responsibilities as stewards.

The care of the environment and the fight against climate change is not a lofty goal for humanity but a **moral imperative**, Pope Francis said in a message to participants of a recent Vatican conference on climate change.

The pope's message reiterated the need for interdisciplinary collaboration, saying that religious, political, social and cultural leaders must work together to form "courageous, cooperative and farsighted efforts" to address the current crisis, reports Junno Arocho Esteves for Catholic News Service.

This message came just days after the Vatican announced a new way it would be lending 'moral support' to the cause by becoming a formal party to the U.N. Framework Convention on Climate Change and by formally joining the 2015 Paris Agreement.



We can act responsibly by urging our local, state and national representatives to investigate and enact measures that will mitigate the dangers to air, water, plant and animal habitats, and human beings most affected by these dangers.

Pope Francis says, This responsibility for God's earth means that human beings, endowed with intelligence, must respect the laws of nature and the delicate equilibria existing between the creatures of this world...The laws found in the Bible dwell on relationships, not only among individuals but also with other living beings. (68)

Pray

Let us pray that we grow in our understanding of our role as

stewards of God's earthly creation, as both a unique privilege and a solemn responsibility.

Let us pray for our leaders and hold them accountable for encouraging good stewardship of the land and its resources.
