
continued study and prayer, he has heard God's call to serve the Church as a Dominican friar.

Special Collections



Next weekend, our parish will take up the Collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS), a collection approved by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops to be taken every three years. The AMS provides pastoral care to Catholic men and women serving in the U.S. Armed Forces, enrolled at a U.S. Military Academy, being treated as a patient at any of the 153 U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Centers, or who work for the federal government beyond U.S. borders including those from our own parish and diocese. The AMS does not receive any funding from the government or military, and has no parishes from which to receive a weekly assessment. ST. RAYMOND OF PENAFORT

- Patron saint of canon lawyers.
- Confessor to a pope and a king
- Joined the Dominican Order at the age of 47, the year after St. Dominic's death.
- Became the second Master of the Order after St.
 Dominic
- Live to 100 years of age (1175-1275)
- Canonized in 1601 by Pope Clement VIII
- Our church was founded on January 23, 1950, on the original feast day of St. Raymond. In 1969, his feast day was moved to January 7, the day after he died.

...HUMBLE YOURSELF THE MORE, THE GREATER YOU ARE, AND YOU WILL FIND FAVOR WITH GOD.

Perhaps the greatest lesson in humility is that we are not the center of the universe. Many people still believe that earth is our domain to be "subdued" and "dominated" as we see fit. However, Pope Francis calls this belief "misguided", reminding us that we are interconnected with the other strands in this web, totally dependent on them for our very being, our health, and our survival.

He also insists that the value of these other creatures rests, not in their usefulness to us, but in their very existence. Each creature of earth has a unique and necessary role to play for the benefit of the whole.

The error of thinking that being made in God's image allows us to dominate and excessively use creation must be replaced by an attitude of humility and gratitude, knowing that "human beings endowed with intelligence and love and drawn by the fullness of Christ are called to lead all creatures back to their Creator" (LS 83)

Lord, help us to understand that our "dominion" over the universe should be understood more properly as responsible stewardship. (CF 116) and help us to take actions to protect our common home.
