

Bring your bibles and bring your questions! We are sure to have a fun night of learning together.



FUN FACT: Our patron, St. Raymond, was the second successor of St. Dominic and served as Master of the Order from 1238 to 1240.

After an early interest in Aerospace Engineering, he shifted tracks and earned a double major in Philosophy and Mathematics at Gonzaga University while studying as a seminarian for the Archdiocese of Seattle. Br. Thomas looks to St. Thomas Aquinas as a model for his Dominican life, particularly noting Thomas's love of Truth and zeal for study. He also shares the Angelic Doctor's love of the Eucharist and frequently savors the Bread of Life Discourse in John 6.

Jesus said to the twelve, "Will you also go away?" Simon Peter answered him, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." (John 6:67-68)

Br. Thomas prays that he will have the supernatural faith to stand by Jesus and confess his belief like St. Peter.



# St. Martin de Porres Blessing of the Animals

St. Martin's Feast Day is Nov. 3.

St. Martin could well be called the "St. Francis of Assisi" of the Dominican Order for his love of animals. The story of his relocation of a large number of destructive mice, while incredible, is regarded as true. Recognizing the havoc the rodents were causing, Martin was seen escorting an orderly line-up of several hundred mice out of the convent and into the garden where they were promised a daily feeding by their kindhearted benefactor.
