



# Master of the Order Visits

On Sunday, October 9, 2022, the Master of the Order of Preachers, Fr. Gerard Timoner III, O.P., concelebrated the 10 am Mass at our church. Twice during his term, Fr. Gerard is required to visit the entire Order, personally or through delegates. Earlier in the day he met with the cloistered nuns at Corpus Christi Monastery, and later celebrated Mass with the Catholic Community at Stanford.

Fr. Gerard was elected the 87th successor to St. Dominic in 2019 in Bien Hoa, Vietnam. Originally, the Master of the Order was elected for life but now serves a 9-year term. When our patron, St. Raymond, was elected the 2nd Master of the



Order after St. Dominic, he slipped in a clause to the Dominican constitution which allowed for early retirement, which he did in 1240.

Fr. Gerard, who hails from the Philippines providence of Camarines Norte, was previously Socius of the Master for Asia-Pacific and prior to that was the Prior Provincial of the Dominican Province of the Philippines. His formal assignment in the Province is in the Priory of Saint Thomas Aquinas in UST, where was once the Vice-Rector for Religious Affairs and Rector of the Central (Interdiocesan) Seminary. In 2014, Fr. Gerard was named a member of the International Theological Commission by Pope Francis himself. As the Master of the Order, Fr. Gerard is UST's Grand Chancellor. He now resides in Rome.

ST. MARTIN DE PORRES BLESSING OF THE ANIMALS SATURDAY, NOV. 5 AT 9:30 AM OUTSIDE THE CHURCH

This year at St. Raymond's we'll be doing the Blessing of the Animals on November 5<sup>th</sup>, the Feast of St. Martin de Porres, OP, at 9:30am in the Church parking lot.

St. Martin was the first black saint from the Americas and stands for interracial and social justice and racial harmony. He was a surgeon and is known for his miraculous cures, for both people and animals! He was a 16<sup>th</sup> century Dr. Doolittle, with the ability to communicate with animals. Like St. Francis, Martin treated animals as if they were brothers and sisters. He treated sick and wounded cats and dogs at his animal hospital set up as one of the first veterinary clinics. He also founded a shelter for stray pets.

One particularly famous story of St. Martin had to do with a mischief of mice who took up residence in a Dominican priory. The other friars wanted to poison the furry invaders, but St. Martin had other plans. Reminiscent of St. Francis' negotiations with the wolf of Gubio, St. Martin promised to keep the mice safe if they would relocate to a little den at the end of the garden and never enter the priory again. In return, St. Martin promised to cater their meals. The mice promptly followed St. Martin out to the garden, St. Martin regularly fed them, and all lived happily ever after.

So, bring your pets to be blessed on November 5<sup>th</sup> at 9:30am. St. Martin, pray for us!
