

Ash Wednesday, Feb. 22 to Palm Sunday, April 2, 2023, Redwood City

The Redwood City campaign of 40 Days for Life begins Ash Wednesday, February 22. It will be held at the public right-of-way outside of Planned Parenthood, 2907 El Camino Real, Redwood City.

For those unacquainted with this program, it is a peaceful prayer and fasting vigil in front of an abortion business where we gather and visibly pray for 12 hours per day for 40 straight days, rain or shine. There must be at least TWO people present at all times. We hold signs (a variety are provided), to indicate the reason for our presence. Two chairs are provided for those needing to sit. We have brochures for a nearby pregnancy care center for those who ask us for information or help. We also sign a form indicating that we will be peaceful and obey the laws as any good citizen would.

Homeless Family Fund




The St. Raymond Homeless Family Fund provides rental assistance to help families and individuals in our community secure permanent housing.

Parish Crafters

Just before the COVID-19 pandemic I attended one of the "Pray-Serve-Socialize" introductory meetings. I liked the idea of gathering in interest groups and being able to meet and form relationships with more of my fellow parishioners. So I started thinking about what interests I have that might be shared by others and which were not yet an activity offered in the parish. Pondering what has drawn people together in the past, I recalled how women would gather to quilt blankets while sharing their experiences and stories.

Since I have always enjoyed crafting things using various materials and taken classes in sewing techniques, forming a crafting group seemed like a possibility. Once this idea came to mind, it blossomed into further thoughts about what types of things we could create that could enrich the lives of others and thus be of service to our community. Also, as we made the items, we could pray for those to whom they would be given, as well as for ourselves as we learned more about one another and the joys and struggles of our lives. Initially, as we came to know each others skills and interests, we could bring whatever we were working on and share ideas about what types of things we would like to make and donate.

I broached the idea to Fr. Jerome, who said, "Go for it." I then spoke with a fellow member of the choir who is a wonderfully creative seamstress. She responded with enthusiasm, so we decided to start once the COVID virus was less of a threat. Last spring we launched the group and began meeting twice a month for about one and a half hours at my home on Santa Cruz Avenue.

At our first gathering I showed the two women who came the boxes of flannel squares that I had inherited from my mother's work with Birthright at St. Matthias Parish in Redwood City. She had had a group of women who cut the squares and made and sold other crafts to buy the materials to create layette sets for mothers who could not afford new clothing for their babies and then donated them to the St. Elizabeth Seton, Sequoia, and Stanford Hospitals. My mother sewed the squares into small quilts and included these with the diapers, clothing, and other items donated to the hospitals.

We decided that our first project would be to sew some of these squares into quilts and find a place to donate them. As shared in a previous bulletin announcement, we were able to donate several small quilts to be given to the children of the families at the Ronald McDonald House. We are still sewing blankets, but have also made some baby bibs and crocheted some hand towels. Expanding the types of items we create and to whom we can give them is an ongoing discussion.

We would love to have more people join us. I am sure
