

A FEAST OF "FAITH-LIFTS"

I love words. Last year, at the start of Lent, our Father John found an artful one for his homily. He summoned us to a new way to think about the holy season in one hyphenated word: faith-lift. It stuck with me. Some of us chuckled at his play on words and marveled at his spiritual creativity. I'm remembering it now as a call, a call to renewal, a remedy for a dry spirit. It's as fresh and enticing a term now as it was a year ago. What could a faith-lift look like in 2023? It seems to me that it's embedded in the central theme of our parish life: "Pray, Serve, Socialize." It's what we do. It's who we are as a parish family.

As we prepare for Lent 2023, our vibrant Catholic community of St. Raymond is summoned to participate in a community-wide *faith-lift*. Our weekly parish bulletin is our calendar of events and offerings. It pulls us into community and provides something for everyone. Our creative parish leadership invites us to a feast.

And then there are the donuts. They are definitely faith-lifting, as are those who set up and serve us when 10am Sunday Mass ends. Hail again to the donut heroes: Paul Mitiguy and his son, John Paul, and their growing band of volunteers and donors. I'm grateful for the opportunity they provide for people to linger and greet one another. I'm grateful too for our priests, deacon, and Brother Anthony who welcome us when we arrive for Mass and engage us outside afterwards. Their presence seems to close the liturgical loop for me after receiving the Eucharist. All are faith-lifters!

Father John, thanks for the *faith-lifting* challenge, for the reminder about joy on the other side of every sorrow, of Jesus's model of cross-deepening faith as we prepare for the resurrection. This can be a *faith-lifting* Lent for all of us.

Hey Buddy, Can You Spare \$20?

In December, we mailed you our financial report for the 2021-2022 year. If you did not get your copy, please stop by the parish office to pick one up. Our report detailed how well we did financially the last fiscal year. For instance, we finished our fiscal year \$81,611 in the black, with healthy reserves in our savings. Praise God! Keep in mind, we accomplished this fiscal reality in a semi-COVID world, while adding staff members to serve you better, and with no Fall Drive. Giddy up! Thank you for your generosity.

At the end of December, we closed our financial books for the first half of the 2022-2023 fiscal year. For the first six months of our fiscal year, we ran a deficit of \$17,769 or \$2,961 a month overall. Our annual budget is \$1,620,670. Thus, our current deficit is a mere 1%. While this deficit is small, it is still a deficit, and I strongly dislike deficits.

I am writing to ask each family to consider adding \$20 a month to their monthly donation. This would eliminate our deficit and give us a little cushion. If you are able to do more, then we have more money to serve you better.

Ash Wednesday, Feb. 22 to Palm Sunday, April 2, 2023, Redwood City

The Redwood City campaign of 40 Days for Life begins Ash Wednesday, February 22. It will be held at the public right-of-way outside of Planned Parenthood, 2907 El Camino Real, Redwood City.

For those unacquainted with this program, it is a peaceful prayer and fasting vigil in front of an abortion business where we gather and visibly pray for 12 hours per day for 40 straight days, rain or shine. There must be at least TWO people present at all times. We hold signs (a variety are provided), to indicate the reason for our presence. Two chairs are provided for those needing to sit. We have brochures for a nearby pregnancy care center for those who ask us for information or help. We also sign a form indicating that we will be peaceful and obey the laws as any good citizen would.

At our Laudato Si' meetings we continue our reading of

A Christian's Guide to Planet Earth by Betsy Painter. In her chapter about mountains and minerals, Painter puts her focus on the hidden treasures beneath the stunning mountains that inspire us and call to mind God's glory. There we find gems and precious metals "concealed in the depths of the earth, discovered only when purposefully sought out... a stunning metaphor about our relationship with God." She teaches of the less glamorous minerals that are the building blocks of the everyday devices and machines we all rely on (smartphones, PCs, medical devices...)

As Christians we have responsibilities for these gifts, from supporting safe mining of earth's treasures, to responsible use of them, and proper disposal. One of the best ways to help is to recycle your electronics properly – they don't belong in land fill. Millions of pounds of rare-earth metals are being recycled every year due to proper disposal [Bayshore Recycling, Best Buy, and Staples have free recycling, along with many non-profits.]

The way we use and treat earth's gifts is part of living the Holy lives we are all called to live.
