

TAIZÉ PRAYER is a simple form of Christian prayer in which we gather around the cross in candlelight to share scripture, chants, silence, and prayer. It is based on the daily prayer of the ecumenical religious community in Taizé, France, which was founded in the aftermath of World War II to promote reconciliation and peace.

We are restarting our program with a Lenten service. If you are familiar with it, enrich your celebration of Lent by sharing this prayer in our parish community. If you have not experienced it before, give yourself the gift of prayer and peace by trying it – all are welcome!! Thursday, March 23, 7:15 pm in the chapel.

The Taizé Prayer Service is: "...a meditative common prayer with, as its high point, singing that never ends and that continues in the silence of one's heart when one is alone again...awakening us to heaven's joy on earth." -- Brother Roger of Taizé



Rejoice with Jerusalem, and be glad for her, all you who love her; rejoice with her in joy, all you who mourn over her—

Thus begins the liturgy for Laetare Sunday when we rejoice because we have

seen the light of God "in all that is good and right and true."

One of those things is the gift of Creation, as Gen.1 says: "and God saw that it was good."

"Once you were darkness, but now in the Lord you are light. Live as children of light" (Eph5:8). In the Gospel, Jesus speaks about spiritual darkness, when we don't recognize our own spiritual blindness. During this Lenten season, may we ask Him to help us see where we are blind to the way God wants us to live. Lent is not a time to fear being wide open to God's guidance. For we know by the life, death, and rising of Jesus, that we can confront our failings held in the firm grip of God's deep love for us.

One place we can all ask for guidance is in the way we care for creation:

Prayer: Heavenly Father, All creation is your handiwork. Help us to see where we are being careless, and by

your grace guide us to cherish the earth, exercise wise stewardship, tread lightly on it, and protect its resources for future generations. Help us approach even the most common things in nature with openness and wonder.



Fasting: Resist apathy that keeps us from doing our part,

even in small ways to care for the planet. "All of us can cooperate as instruments of God for the care of creation". (LS14)
