




2nd Sunday of Lent - March 16, 2025



# BECOMING FULLY AWAKE, THEY SAW HIS GLORY

Weekly Gospel Reflection (Lk 9:28b-36)

The transfiguration is an excellent metaphor for the spiritual life. We have to go up a mountain, expending effort to find a place of solitude to pray. The mountain is away from the city and has few people or things there to distract us from God.

There, we have to pray. Jesus prayed to give us a positive example. If we don't speak to God in the silence of our hearts, we won't grow our relationship with Him.

We must stay awake, though it will be with much effort. We must stay awake through attention in prayer or by returning to our efforts to grow in virtue when we've lost focus or started to nod off.

If we persist, we may be rewarded with a tiny glimpse of God's glory. Perhaps—like Peter, James, and John—we will get to see some mystery of God. This sort of consolation is to encourage us, strengthening us in following the way and also helping us find fortitude not to be scandalized by the Cross.

How often are we surprised that God doesn't do what we expect? Just like the Apostles, we're shocked by the reality of Jesus's Crucifixion. These Transfiguration moments should be saved up and remembered when our faith is tested.

Next, we should offer to make God a dwelling, since God loves those—like King David and Simon Peter—who offer to make Him a place to stay. But, God really prefers the perfect tabernacle He has built Himself: the human heart, since the Kingdom of God is within you.

So clean out your heart, removing all the hobbies, relationships, and thoughts that are not bringing you closer to God. Make your heart a pure, holy tabernacle, a place for our God dwell.

We should also remember that, like Peter, who offered to make God a tent, we don't get to do those task that we volunteer to do. Rather, we must remember that Jesus is the Son of God and He will give us tasks that are both more difficult and more fruitful than those we could come up with ourselves. However, do not worry, God will give you the graces that you need to fulfil the tasks He gives you. He will do the work through you and in you.

Also, we cannot stay on the mountain. We have to go down—down to minister, to heal others, and ultimately to suffer and die for love.

# **RCIA - Rite of Election**

On March 9, the Archdiocese of San Francisco celebrated the Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion at the Cathedral of St. Mary of the Assumption. This significant event marked a pivotal step for more than 650 individuals from 57 parishes—384 candidates and 269 catechumens—on their journey toward full communion with the Catholic Church.

Maryknoll Workers Respond to Pope Francis' Call to Care for the Environment

Here's what Maryknoll lay volunteers, sisters, brothers and priests are doing for the environment, and the vulnerable people, in areas harshly impacted by climate change. In this Jubilee Year of Hope, especially during Lent, please remember in prayer the sacrifices of these faithful people:

- In Guatemala, Maryknoll Sisters work with Eco Farm projects situated amid areas devastated by single crop farming practices, introducing biodiverse farming methods that foster more resilient food supplies.
- In Kenya, the Maryknoll Fathers and Brothers support a reforestation project in the semi-arid area of Kibwezi, growing drought-resistant trees that provide a source of nutrition and income to the community, especially during the dry seasons.
- In El Salvador, Maryknoll Lay Missioners have worked for many years near Cojutepeque promoting sustainable agriculture and greater environmental awareness, allowing families to grow more crops, conserve water, and save seeds for the next planting.
- In Panama, Maryknoll Sisters transformed 100 acres of deforested land into a vibrant rainforest ecosystem and permaculture farm.
- At the United Nations, Maryknoll missioners will attend the UN Conference on Biodiversity and "Strengthening Indigenous and Local Community Partnerships".

Maryknoll representatives to the UN also advocate for protection for environmental advocates in Latin America who are threatened with significant violence.

Lent is a wonderful time for prayerful reflection on our lives and on the many gifts and graces that God bestows on us. Please join the Laudato Si' group each Tuesday evening at 7 pm during Lent for a 30-minute Zoom gathering to reflect on the beauty of God's gift of creation through readings and prayer together.

# **School Corner**

St. Raymond School's Catholic Academic Junior High Decathlon team placed second overall at the San Francisco Archdiocese competition and first in mathematics (Thomas Kane) and religion (Catie Williams).

The Catholic Academic Junior High Decathlon is a one-day competition for Catholic school students in grades 6-8.

There are 10 events. Two are collaborative team efforts – a Logic Quiz with 20 rigorous thinking problems, and a Super Quiz with 50 multiple choice questions on five broad academic themes. The remaining eight events test individual knowledge of Roman Catholic Doctrine, English, Literature, Science, Mathematics, Current Events, Social Studies, and Fine Arts (Art and Music).


