

DOMINICAN CORNER

I KNOW THEM AND THEY FOLLOW ME

What does it mean for God to truly know us? Br. Alphonsus Vu, O.P., reflects on the Gospel for the Fourth Sunday of Easter.

Welcome to the Fourth Sunday of Easter. This Sunday is also called "Good Shepherd Sunday." Jesus, in the Gospel, shows himself to be a Good Shepherd; He says, "I know my sheep."

Jesus says that He knows His sheep. The verb "know" has a variety of meanings. I can say that I "know" the name of the cashier by looking at his badge. This knowledge is superficial because it is only concerned with the external.

I can also say that I "know" my classmate's favorite sport and his thoughts on certain issues. This kind of knowledge is deeper than the first one, because it takes me time spent with my classmate to know.

But there is also another kind of knowledge, as the knowledge of a mother has of her child. She knows exactly what the child needs by looking at the child in the eyes. This knowledge is deep because it is the result of an intimate human relationship.

But there is another kind of knowledge: God's knowledge. The knowledge of God transcends all human understanding and all human knowledge. God knows not only our thoughts and desires, but He also knows us to the very core of our being.

He knows our weaknesses and strengths, our hopes and desires, and what we need the most. This knowledge of God is most comforting because, by this, we are assured that we are not the product of random chance in the cosmos. We are known and loved by God and we are not a being floating through the universe among other beings.

And, because we are known and loved by God, the only thing that we should do is open our hearts to receive the love of God into our hearts, and to follow Him.

OUR LADY OF FATIMA

(MAY 13)

From a homily from Fr. Reginald Martin, O.P., on the feast of Our Lady of Fatima in 2017.

Let me say a word about today's feast. As you know, I directed our Dominican Rosary Center for a decade or so, so today is very special. It is particularly noteworthy because this year marks the one hundredth anniversary of the Blessed Virgin's apparition to the three children at Fatima, in Portugal. What's unfortunate about Fatima is that is can get bogged down with secrets and private revelations, and - whatnot - until it begins to seem something like a video game. In fact, just about all we need to know about Fatima is that Mary told three children to pray for peace at a time when the world was committed to a devastating war. And the prayer Mary asked them to offer was the Rosary.

When asked about the importance of the Rosary, Lucia, one of the children, responded:

"... the Rosary is of greatest value not only according to the words of Our Lady .. but according to the effects of the Rosary one sees throughout history. My impression is that Our Lady wanted to give ordinary people, who might not know how to pray, this simple method of getting closer to God."

The Rosary is a prayer that can be prayed by anyone. Pope Paul VI pointed out, it not only recalls to mind the saving events of our salvation, but encourages the will to draw from them the norms for living the Christian life.


ENROLL IN THE ROSARY CONFRATERNITY




After rescuing a boy from ruthless child traffickers, a federal agent learns the boy's sister is still captive and decides to embark on a dangerous mission to save her.
