





A VERY BRIEF PARISH TIMELINE

1949 - Archbishop John J. Mitty purchased an 11-acre parcel of land from James & Clara McGinnis.

January 23, 1950 - On the feast day of St. Raymond of Peñafort, St. Raymond Church was established with Msgr. Edwin J. Kennedy as pastor.

October 9, 1954 - St. Raymond School opens.

November 29, 1959 - The new St. Raymond Church opens.

December 26, 1959 - First wedding at the new St. Raymond Church between Richard Blach and Gail Derry.

1965 - The parish builds the first Parish Center, later renamed the "Msgr. Edwin J. Kennedy Center".

1978 - Fr. Ray Zohlen becomes the second pastor. The first pastoral council is formed.

1984 - Fr. Edward Phelan becomes the third pastor. During this time, the vacant lot between the Church and Arbor Road was turned into our Rose Garden.

1995 - Fr. Patrick Michaels becomes the fourth pastor.

July 2013 - The Dominican Friars of the Province of the Most Holy Name of Jesus (Western Dominican Province) arrive with Fr. Christopher Fadok, O.P., becoming the first Dominican pastor. Dominican friars at Arbor House also minister to the Catholic Community at Stanford and the Dominican nuns at Corpus Christi Monastery.

2025 - St. Raymond celebrated 75 years as a parish. Help is needed to expand this timeline!

Liturgical-Minded Menlo Park

Dedicate New St. Raymond's Church Sunday

The new St. Raymond's Church — built to make Catholics feel at home around the altar — will be dedicated Sunday at the 9:30 a.m. congregation-sung Mass.

The dedication ceremony, by Bishop Merlin J. Guillefoyle, climaxes a long collaboration among parishioners, artists, and pastor in creating a church that is more than a hall of worship but rather an extension of every Catholic home in the parish.

It is a gem of monastic simplicity, which by its architecture and its art invites all to participate, actively, in the sacrifice of the Mass.

GRACIOUS

Menlo Park has long been known for its gracious living. Parishioners of St. Raymond's, Menlo Park, could ask for no more gracious church in which to offer their worship as "Christians around the altar."

St. Raymond's combines two concurrent strains in American Catholic thinking: brick-and-mortar practicality and the most visionary aspect of the theology of the Mystical Body.

It is not only avant garde in its modern architectural lines and appointments, it is the fruitification of a living liturgical movement among parishioners.

LOCAL ARTISTS

St. Raymond's represents the work of local artists and the integration of the church plant within the community landscape.

The church building is laid out in the form of a huge cross, roof lines culminating in a copper clad cupola surmounted by a fleche — an open arrow pointing skyward — topped by a splendidly simple aluminum cross.

The basic materials used in the church structure are brick and redwood — honest, sincere materials that represent stability and harmony with the community landscape.

ALTAR CENTERED

Inside, St. Raymond's is altar centered. A single slab of Indiana limestone is supported by one-ton pedestals of the same material centered at the intersection of transept and nave. A workman working on the church interior told the pastor the rugged stone altar reminded him of a stone of sacrifice — and so it might. It also recalls the ancient festive tables of medieval banquet halls.

From the altar the four wings radiate to form a cross. The lateral wings seat 250; the main chapel seats 450. Fifty more can be seated in the choir loft directly behind the altar.

The Baptistry, centered in the narthex, is the introduction to the interior, which focuses on the altar with its huge monstache-shaped balustrade artistically reflecting the center of Christian worship, the Eucharist.

"Anyone looking out the windows will see Nature herself worshipping: the winds, the plants, the rain — they are not distracting, they all manifest God's gifts to man and Nature's reflection of God's beauty," says the pastor.

Art consultants were William Hartnett and Associates. The sculptor was Michael Lyn Genuing. Metal arts are by Victor Ries and Hans Graw.

LANDSCAPE

Henry Chescoe of San Francisco is the architect. William Burroughs the contractor. Landscaping is by architect Arthur Cobbleddick and landscape construction by Hestie-Schroeder.

The landscape features juniper, boxwood and magnolia. The pepper trees on the parkway and the clusters of oaks on the surrounding peninsula property complete the gracious Peninsula setting.






